### Quran-Khani – Be aware of innovations!

In many Muslim countries, when someone dies, the family members gather together and recite Quran in a group or individually and after finishing the Quran they ask Allaah to send the reward of this action for the deceased soul. This certain practice has no foundation in the Sunnah. The Prophet (saw) in his life time lost his beloved wife (Khadijah), his children, uncle (Hamza) and many other close friends and companions. He (saw) never gathered his family members and told them to read Quran or finish Quran for the deceased. Hence, this practice is one of those events that are innovated and we Muslims should advise each other not to participate in this bid'ah. All bid'ahs will lead us to misguidance and all misguidance to Hellfire.

### Garden of good deeds that we gained – let's not destroy it!

By the blessings of Allaah, Ramadaan opens the door of fasting, prayer, charity, reading the Quran, I'tikaf and many other good deeds. It is like a garden that believers create to enjoy the fruit in the hereafter. However, Shaytan who is our eternal enemy, never gives up and is always there to destroy this garden! We need to realize that when we do good deeds, it removes evil deeds and similarly when someone does evil deeds it can efface or wipe good deeds. Some sins that effaces good deeds are but not limited to:

Disbelief in Allaah and his Messenger, mocking the religion, the Prophets and the companions, committing bid'ah, backbiting, slandering, raising voice over the voice of Allaah and His Messenger etc... are those crimes and sins that effaces partially and in many cases (may Allaah forbid) completely all the good deeds.

Below are verses that shows the catastrophic danger of evil deeds. So, O brothers! Pay attention!

*O you who believe! Do not render in vain your Sadaqah (charity) by reminders of your generosity or by injury, like him who spends his wealth to be seen of men, and he does not believe in Allah, nor in the Last Day. His likeness is the likeness of a smooth rock on which is a little dust; on it falls heavy rain which leaves it bare. They are not able to do anything with what they have earned. And Allah does not guide the disbelieving people. [Al-Baqarah verse 264]*

*O you who believe! Obey Allah, and obey the Messenger (Muhammad ﷺ) and render not vain your deeds. [Sura Mohammad, verse 33]*

*O you who believe! Do not put (yourselves) forward before Allah and His Messenger (ﷺ), and fear Allah. Verily! Allah is All-Hearing, All-Knowing. O you who believe! Raise not your voices above the voice of the Prophet (ﷺ), nor speak aloud to him in talk as you speak aloud to one another, lest your deeds may be rendered fruitless while you perceive not. [Sura Hujurat, verse 1&2]*

Ubaid Ibn Umair reported:

Once 'Umar (bin Al-Khattab) said to the companions of the Prophet "What do you think about this Verse:--"Does any of you wish that he should have a garden?" They replied, "Allah knows best." 'Umar became angry and said, "Either say that you know or say that you do not know!" On that Ibn Abbas said, "O chief of the believers! I have something in my mind to say about it." Umar said, "O son of my brother! Say, and do not under estimate yourself." Ibn Abbas said, "This Verse has been set up as an example for deeds." Umar said, "What kind of deeds?" Ibn Abbas said, "For deeds." Umar said, "This is an example for a rich man who does goods out of obedience of Allah and then Allah sends him Satan whereupon he commits sins till all his good deeds are lost." [Saheeh Al-Bukhari]
