Isaa Ibn Maryam [Jesus the son of Mary] ‘alayhis-salaam

- We must learn about Isaa Ibn Maryam from the Quran and the sunnah only. There is no third source of revelation. Although we do believe in Torah, Injeel and Zabur but since the words have been changed, we are not allowed to

depend on them to relate the story of Isaa or any other prophets and Messengers of Allaah or any matter of the religion.

- A very limited amount of information has been given to us, so those questions for which we don't have answers, we will relate that knowledge to Allaah only...
- We will hear lots of myths about this great prophet since we live in a land where the people claim to love him, follow him etc... We need to know that we the Muslims have the real story of Isaa and his mother.
- Many speakers rely on israyliyyats (the stories from the corrupted books of the Jews and Christians) and inject these stories in their talks, khutbah and lessons. We must be careful to verify the sources as we hear all this nonsense!
- It is our responsibility to learn the real story of Prophet Isaa from the right sources and deliver that to the next generation.

About Prophet Isaa:

- Prophet Isaa was one of the prophets and Messengers sent to Bani Israel. Between him and our Prophet there is no other prophet
- The Christians claim that he was born between 6BC and 4 BC. Their claim has no proof. There is nothing authentic to claim that Prophet Isaa was born such and such years before the birth of Prophet Mohammad (Sallallaahu 'alayhi wa sallam).
- His birth was miraculous, i.e he had no father involved in his birth. Allaah created him from a mother, Maryam 'alayhas-salaam. He is not the son of God, he is not part of God, not part of trinity. Neither he nor his mother ever called people to deify them, worship them, build statues of them etc...
- He was born in Summer. Any smart and wise person would figure out that the celebration of his birthday on December 25th is a great lie and heresy. Even many Christian denominations don't celebrate Christmas and consider it a heresy. So, how can a Muslim celebrate it, enjoy it!
- He spoke from the cradle and showed amazing miracles to the people to call them to Allaah.
- He was taught Torah and the Injil.
- A very few people accepted his message and in the Quran they are referred to as "Hawariyy..." or the "righteous from ahlel Kitab" or "nasara"
- Prophet Isaa is not the founder of Christianity or any religion. His religion was Islam and his true followers were Muslims, our brothers in

Islam. To Allaah the only acceptable religion is Islam. In Sura Imran

إِنَّ الدِّينَ عِنْدَ اللَّهِ الْإِسْلَامُ ۗ وَمَا اخْتَلَفَ الَّذِينَ أُوتُوا الْكِتَابَ إِلَّا مِنْ بَعْدِ مَا جَاءَهُمُ الْعِلْمُ بَغْيًا بَيْنَهُمْ ۗ وَمَنْ يَكْفُرْ بِآيَاتِ اللَّهِ فَإِنَّ اللَّهَ سَرِيعُ الْحِسَابِ

- Truly, the religion with Allah is Islam. Those who were given the Scripture (Jews and Christians) did not differ except, out of mutual jealousy, after knowledge had come to them. And whoever disbelieves in the Ayat (proofs, evidence, verses, signs, revelations, etc.) of Allah, then surely, Allah is Swift in calling to account.
- When the people plotted against him, Allaah protected him and raised him in the sky, and he will come back as a sign of the day of Judgment and when he will come back, he will rule by the Quran and sunnah of our Prophet. So, he will come back as a follower of Mohammad Sallallaahu 'alayhi wa sallam.
- He will come back as a sign of the day of Judgment, and he will kill Dajjal, break the cross and kill the pig!
- After the killing of Dajjal, two powerful nations, Ya'juj and Ma'juj will come out. Allaah will command Prophet Isaa to take the believers and go into the mountains. Then Allaah will cause the two nations to die in one night. After this trial, there will be an abundance of goodness and barakah and blessings. Prophet Isaa will live and die and finish his life cycle like any other human being.
- Today the true followers of Prophet Isaa are the Muslims, those who follow the Quran and the sunnah.
- We have no evidence to claim when he will come back he will marry, have children etc... There are some weak narrations that claim he will die and will be buried in the side of the Prophet Mohammad (Sallallaahu 'alayhi wa sallam). None of these are authentic and the knowledge belongs to Allaah!
